Nature of support 2015/16:
<p>Professional development was provided for all staff by a specialist dance teacher who worked alongside staff to improve confidence, plan and develop sequences and routines linked to year group topics. All staff were given the opportunity to attend INSETS relevant to their specific year group. Playground Buddies were trained by Fun4Kidz over a course of two days, welfare staff also attended training in November 2015. Buddies helped to keep children active and happy on the yard. Some Key Stage 2 children attended partnership competitions including: Year 2 sports hall athletics, Year 3 multi skills, sports ambassadors event, speed stacking training for Year 3, Year 5 7 6 swimming gala, football competitions at Everton and Liverpool. Three football teams from Year 5 & 6 competed in the Faye and Griffith's cup. Year 5 were runners up in the Faye cup. The girls' football team played at the Jade Matthew's tournament. Year 5 & 6 also entered basketball competition. L. May attended netball training and started a netball club for Year 6 boys and girls. L. May and K. Garvey attended a planning and delivering PE INSET using Lancashire schemes which were then shared with KS1 and 2 staff. L. Kiggins attended a one-day training course for tennis and received new tennis equipment for school. Sports Day was themed as an Olympic Games event and was very successful working with sports ambassadors from Savio High School and the SSCo (A. Watt). K. Garvey attended partnership meetings each term to plan events and discuss competitions. Mini Whistlers were trained and qualified for Key Stage 2 yard and a wide range of break time activities including, Ezy riders, tennis nets, basketball and football games were organized. Installation of hard standing football goals and netball goals on KS2 playground along with themed boards (target shot and cricket etc) in existing colour zoned playareas.</p>
